CHANGES ON THE SCHOOL BUS SCHEDULE

This week's candidate is Omar Passons, Democratic candidate for County Board of Supervisors, District 4.

The County Board of Supervisors has the power to affect your lives in areas such as local environment, mass transit, law enforcement, homelessness, and social services including healthcare and nutrition.

The 4th district includes a diverse group of San Diego neighborhoods including UC San Diego, La Jolla Village, Clairemont, Kearny Mesa, Mission Beach, Ocean Beach, Linda Vista, Downtown, Hillcrest, North Park, South Park, City Heights, and Southeast San Diego.

If you live in any of these neighborhoods, you have an opportunity to ask Mr. Passons questions about how we would improve life in your neighborhoods if he is elected to represent you. If you do not live in District 4 and are simply interested in the political process, you are also welcome to attend.

UC/CSU Eligibility Policy:

The mission of The Preuss School is to prepare students for acceptance to a 4-year university. In order for seniors to take advantage of the school's mission, students from grades 8-11 need to be on track to be UC/CSU College eligible.

-In order to be on track towards college eligibility, students in grades 8-11 need to pass their Math, English, Science, and History classes with a C- or better.

-Students earning lower than a C- need to take advantage of Preuss' many academic supports to improve their academic performance.

-Students earning lower than a C- who DO NOT take advantage of Preuss' supports will have the opportunity to get back on track towards college eligibility by repeating an entire grade.
