Covered California

- By law, most people are now required to have health insurance or pay a penalty when they file their taxes.
- Californians can apply through Covered California and select the health insurance plan that works best for their needs and budget.
- The open-enrollment period happens once a year. Once open enrollment ends, you may enroll in a Covered California health plan only if you have a qualifying life event that makes you eligible to apply.
- Some examples of qualifying life events are: losing your health coverage, getting married, moving outside your plan's coverage area, having a baby and turning 26. 

New Eligibility Policy


Preuss' goal is for seniors to be college eligible

- Starting in 9th grade, students need to pass their Math, English, Science, and History classes next year with a C or better
- If students earn a D or less, they need take advantage our Preuss' opportunities to improve academically throughout the year (SEA, tutoring, test corrections, etc.)

Students who earn a D or less and DO NOT take advantage of SEA, Tutoring, test corrections, summer school, etc., may be retained in 9th grade in order to give them another chance at becoming eligible

How you can ensure success at home...

- Having a nightly routine that you *both* participate in is critical.
 - Check-in at the beginning and end/supervise homework time
 - My student will need to do ____ hours of homework every night.
- Set aside discussion time to review planner together and converse about school
- Prioritize and organize assignments

Academic Support from Home

- Provide appropriate study space
- Homework time without TV or phone
- Limit internet / computer video games
- Tutoring After School or SEA
- Good nutrition and plenty of sleep
- An uncluttered workspace
- Provide needed school materials
- Help practice and refine skills that are helpful in becoming a strong college applicant



But… I don't have any homework?

- Ask about every class and find out what they're working on. See if there are future deadlines that a student can start working toward (think about small steps they can take to meet the goal).
- Study English Vocab and test their words with you.
- Study History passwords and test their words with you.
- Re-read English and history texts.
- Every student should have 3 hours of homework per night and do at least 1 hour of studying as a plan B.

Homework

- When you get home tonight, set up a nightly routine with your student set expectations and set a time.
- Follow through 100% of the time. Be consistent.
- Make sure you understand their schedule, classes and planner.
- Homework discussion suggestion:
- "What did you do in block 1 today? What is your homework? What could you do to get ahead in this class?"
