
TROLLEY CELEBRATION TODAY

- Assess frequency of fruit and vegetable (F/V)
 consumption in parents and students
- Identify factors associated with F/V consumption
- Recommendations on how to increase F/V intake to students, parents, and The Preuss School







Survey Questions

Parent Survey



- A total of 173 parents completed a 7 question survey.
- Asked about the frequency parents consumed F/V at home and their perception of their children's consumption



Survey Questions


Student Survey \square



- A total of 166 students completed a 17 question online survey.
- Asked about the student's F/V consumption as well as their parents and peers
- Also inquired about whether students received encouragement to eat more F/V



Survey Results



Associated Factors

Home

- Availability of F/V at home
- Parent consumption and encouragement of F/V
- Eating home cooked dinners
- Eating dinner together as a family



Associated Factors

School

- Availability of F/V at school
- ♦ Staff encouragement to eat F/V
- Friends' consumption of F/V

WHAT IS ADVISORY OR UNIVERSITY PREP?

- Advisory is a class that serves as a structured system of student support. This class serves many functions. It has its own curriculum that consists of a variety of lessons, activities, and instruction from the following content areas:
 - College research, preparation, and information
 - Behaviors that encourage success in school
 - Character development, healthy lifestyles, and decision making
 - Reading and math support (KBAR and KBAC)
 - Event and test preparation
 - Academic subject support through tutorials or access to resources in class



WHAT IS THE PURPOSE OF ADVISORY?

- The main purpose of advisory is to provide extra support for our students so they can reach or exceed academic eligibility for selective institutions of higher learning.
- Another important purpose of the advisory program is to create a support network for the students.
 - The advisory teacher is the student's first point of contact on campus and the first point of contact for parents.
 - Students stay with the same group of grade-level peers throughout their Preuss education and develop strong bonds with each other and the teacher.



WHAT HAPPENS DURING ADVISORY?

- Advisory class is not just a study hall or tutorial period.
 - Students complete assignments and projects just like they do for any other class.
 - Every class has KBAR each day and KBAC once per week.
- The content standards for this class are The Preuss School UCSD's ESLRs:

A knowledgeable, critical thinker	A technologically-literate user
A communicator	A healthy, balanced individual
A collaborator	A global good citizen



WHAT ARE THE RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE ADVISORY TEACHER?

- Provide a classroom environment that encourages school success.
- Prepare the class for upcoming school wide events.
- Develop plans and interventions for students who are struggling academically.
- Regularly monitor students' grades and communicate with parents, teachers, and counselors about student achievement.
- Schedule initial student interventions as needed and expect to attend those meetings.
- Inform the appropriate school counselor of any potential problems.
