ATTENDANCE

Dear Parents,

The second semester is now upon us, and I would like to take this opportunity to emphasize the value of daily attendance for student learning.

As a reminder we ask parents to plan time off from school in accordance with our school calendar. We urge students and families to avoid absences before and after the scheduled breaks. The next long vacation is Summer Break, so please ensure that you plan your travel after the last day of school, June 17th.

Regular attendance is critical to a student's success in school. Students who are frequently absent miss social interaction and direct instruction from teachers, even if written assignments can be made up.

As long as your child is healthy, please support the school by sending your student to attend class. If your child is struggling and needs support, please reach out to our nurse and counselors who can provide you with resources to better support your family. Verification of Absences

Parents are required to verify an absence by calling or sending a note to the attendance office in order to validate the reason for the student's absence. You can report your child's absence to Ms. Allie Lee at (858) 822-0311 or e-mail to attendance@preuss.ucsd.edu. If you verify an absence through ParentSquare, please make sure you clear the absence on the day the student missed school.

Parents may call to verify a child's absence up to 72 hours after the child has been absent. Absences that are not verified will be considered unexcused absences. After our attendance month accounting cycle closes, unexcused absences due to no verification cannot be changed.

Attendance Challenge

The School Attendance Challenge Program is a new positive enforcement strategy to encourage students to attend school regularly through a monthly competition between all grade levels. The class with the highest attendance will be recognized and rewarded with an ice cream social sponsored by the PTA. Our objective is to raise awareness of the importance of regular school attendance and to support student's efforts in attending school every day. Regular attendance students on a path to success at the Preuss School. The ultimate attendance goal is to achieve an overall attendance rate of 97% or higher and encourage students to attend school Please help us to achieve this goal. Library notices are sent via students' @preuss.ucsd.edu email at the beginning of each month. Notices inform the students what library materials and textbooks are late, and what fines to be paid or waived by volunteering. Every half hour in the library waives \$5.00 off their fines. Students may volunteer in the mornings before school or during their lunch. Online library information is on the <u>Preuss School website</u>. A great feature is <u>Brainfuse</u>, 24/7 access to live tutoring in most core subjects and many electives. Tutors have degrees in their subjects and all conversations are monitored. We have links to our databases, Sora by Overdrive (our ebook collection site) and many other resources. Sora is also accessible by downloading the SORA APP on their phone, finding the Preuss School and using their student ID number to login.
