A Note From Attendance



Attendance Works

Attending school regularly helps students feel better about school and themselves. Parents can help building this habit so they learn that going to school on time, every day is important. When students attend regularly, they are much more likely to read proficiently, do well in middle and high school and graduate.

Dear Parent/ Guardian

Are you planning a family trip for the Summer Break? As you think about your arrangements, we want to stress the importance of sending your child to school every day possible. Every year, absences spike in the weeks before and after the school break as families squeeze in a few more vacation days. It's time to break that cycle. We know that just a few missed days here and there, even if they are excused absences, can add up to too much lost learning time and put your child behind in school. Remember that too many absences can affect a student's chances for academic success and eventually for graduation.

We recognize that school breaks are an important time for reconnecting with families. The costs of plane tickets often influence when you want to travel. But keep in mind the costs to your children's education if they miss too much school and the message you will be sending about the importance of attendance. Even if you've got a homework packet from a teacher, it doesn't make up for the interaction and learning that happens in the classroom. Our teachers will be teaching, and our students will be learning right up until vacation starts and the first day back. You can help us convey that message.

This spring season, help your children develop the habit of attending regularly and on time. Families play a key role in making sure students get to school safely every day and understand why attendance is so important for success in their school. Avoid scheduling vacations when school is in session. They are considered unexcused absences. When you plan vacations, we suggest to do it in accordance to our school calendar. These absences break the routine of daily attendance that contributes to students feeling connected and engaged in learning.

Let us know how we can help you. If your child is not able to attend school for any reason, please contact the attendance office to discuss options to keep your child on track. Teachers and counselors can assist your child with a re-engagement plan.

I would like to remind you all that the school is using Parent Square for attendance notifications. You should receive an email and/or text message from Parent Square when your child is marked absent or tardy. This is the right time to give us a call to provide a reason for absence. You can report an absence by calling to the attendance office at (858) 822-0311 or the main office (858) 822-3000.

News From College and Workforce Coordinator


Hello everyone!

Library notices are sent via students' @preuss.ucsd.edu email at the beginning of each month. Notices inform the students what library materials and textbooks are late, and what fines need to be paid or covered by volunteering. Every half hour in the library earns \$5.00 towards their fines. Students may volunteer in the mornings before school or during their lunch.

Eighth Graders will not be able to participate in "A Celebration of Learning" and Seniors will not be able to receive their diploma unless their account is completely cleared. Notices regarding 'How to clear accounts' to participate in the end of the year ceremony and to make sure Seniors receive their diploma will be sent home with all 8th and 12th grade students after spring break. Parents/ guardians will be required to sign the notice. No need to wait, now is the time to take care of

Students are also able to access eBooks by downloading the SO-RA APP on their phone and using their student ID number to login.

Swim Program

We are excited to offer a swim program this Spring for scholars in two of Mrs. Williston's EHS (Exercise and Health Science) classes. This year's program is a Pilot Program which will only be done with two classes in order to learn what sorts of things work and what don't. We will compile all that we learn this year in order to offer the program next year to more classes. This year's program is being funded mostly by a grant from the Prevent Drowning Foundation who has helped us to move this great program from just a dream to reality.

The class will begin on April 18th and continue through May 18th. Classes will be held every Tuesday and Thursday during their regularly scheduled EHS class. We will walk to and from the Canyonview Aquatic Center on UCSD's campus (about half a mile away). Scholars will be given assessments during the first week of lessons to determine their comfort level in the water and grouped accordingly. There will be instructors for each group of scholars and lifeguards on deck. The program's goal is to get all scholars more water safe. Each group will progress at its own pace.



Basic water safety Basic water smarts to include

- Stepping or jumping into the water overhead
- Floating, treading, for a minute
- Finding an exit to a pool
- Swimming 25 yards
 Exiting a pool without
- Exiting a pool without a ladder

- Learning their limitation
- Swimming with others where lifeguards are on duty
- Wearing a life vest
- How to call for help
- Understanding things such as ocean currents, dangers in shallow water, hazards in the ocean, etc.

We hope students and parents are as excited about the program as we are. However, if they do not want to participate (in the pool) actively, they may opt out of that part of the program. Scholars who opt out will still come to the pool with us, but stay on the pool deck and learn from there.

We surveyed each student about bathing suits, goggles, and towels and will purchase items for students in need.



The Preuss student compositions in large scale banners were hung in the Mandeville foyer for attendees to enjoy before the Symphony Concert, "Spheres"! In addition, Mauricio Salas and Liam Rodriguez played their original compositions with a quartet from the symphony before the show and were well received! Professor Emeritus of music and former Thurgood Marshall College Provost, Cecil Lytle, who is also one of the founding professors of the Preuss School, appreciated the depth of our collaboration and has helped to facilitate a stronger union between UC San Diego Arts and Humanities and the Preuss School.





The Festival of the Arts 2023, celebrated its 8th year anniversary with our best displays and talent yet! Studio I artists showcased their still life works along with water colors and master artist recreations! Studio II focused on their Old Town landscapes, moses inspired hats from their trip to the Mengei and Biza Butler inspired portraits of people and animals. Mr. Rocca is also launching a career pathway Film Internship program for our senior wheel. Scholars interested in pursuing an education and possible career in film will be given the unique opportunity to learn the tools, technologies, and vast array of vocations within the entertainment industry. It is Mr. Rocca's hope that this will pave the way for a paid internship for students to work on his set during production of his feature film this summer!

More exciting updates to come as the Film Internship is launched and *Shake-speare Festival* has its epic debut. And be on the lookout for news about two live stage performances to come as well, *Pop Culture Festival* in April and our annual epilogue, *Jazz June*!
