UC/CSU Eligibility Policy:

The mission of The Preuss School is to prepare students for acceptance to a 4-year university. In order for seniors to take advantage of the school's mission, students from grades 8-11 need to be on track to be UC/CSU College eligible.

In order to be on track towards college eligibility, students in grades 8-11 need to pass their Math, English, Science, and History classes with a C- or better.

Students earning lower than a C- need to take advantage of Preuss' many academic supports to improve their academic performance.

Students earning lower than a C- who DO NOT take advantage of Preuss' supports will have the opportunity to get back on track towards college eligibility by repeating an entire grade.

Students, if you don't want to repeat a grade, pass your classes with at least a C- or take advantage of the school's supports, including SEA, tutoring, tutorials, test corrections, counseling, and summer school.
