UC/CSU Eligibility Policy:

The mission of The Preuss School is to prepare students for acceptance to a 4-year university. In order for seniors to take advantage of the school's mission, students from grades 8-11 need to be on track to be UC/CSU College eligible.

- -In order to be on track towards college eligibility, students in grades 8-11 need to pass their Math, English, Science, and History classes with a C- or better.
- -Students earning lower than a C- need to take advantage of Preuss' many academic supports to improve their academic performance.
- -Students earning lower than a C- who DO NOT take advantage of Preuss' supports will have the opportunity to get back on track towards college eligibility by repeating an entire grade.
- -Students, if you don't want to repeat a grade, pass your classes with at least a C- or take advantage of the school's supports, including SEA, tutoring, tutorials, test corrections, counseling, and summer school.
- -Bottom line: if you want to go to a 4-year college, work hard and we'll help get you there! (8/25 Mr. Ramos)
