The 18th amendment of the U.S. Constitution is ratified, prohibiting the "manufacture, sale, or transportation of intoxicating liquors for beverage purposes." The Prohibition Amendment was a result of the constant pressure of temperance societies concerned with the negative effects of alcohol. Because of large disapproval and failure to prevent organized distribution of such beverages, the 21st Amendment was passed in 1933, repealing the Prohibition Amendment. (1919) (Greco 1/16)

**Preuss Model United Nations announcement to develop "Good Global Citizens:
The Current Government Shutdown**

The government shutdown that is currently transpiring in our nation has entered its record-breaking third week. This calamity was the product of a deadlock centering around an argument in which President Trump sought to include \$5.7 billion in funding for a border wall as part of an upcoming bill on a House of Representatives-approved continuing resolution to fund the United States Government. Trump refused to sign the necessary resolution into law because the Democrats are unwilling to provide funding for the wall. As a result, nearly 800,000 federal workers are furloughed or are working without pay. After missing their paychecks, many of them cannot pay their bills or mortgage payments and are struggling to support their families. Looking forward, it is important to evaluate whether or not Trump's wall is really worth the livelihoods of federal employees, especially considering that both sides are unwilling to compromise.
