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A Message from our School Principal-Director Scott Barton

Dear Parents,

This year The Preuss School UC San Diego is celebrating its twentieth year. The school opened its doors in 1999 in portable buildings on UC San Diego's Thurgood Marshall Campus with 150 students in grades 6-8. The Preuss campus as we know it today was completed in the year 2000 and classes began in the fall of 2000. In the past twenty years, Preuss graduates have consistently been accepted to four-year colleges and universities with a rate of more than 90 percent. Nearly 100 percent of our graduates go to some form of higher education. Preuss has had 39 Gates Millennium Scholarship recipients and millions of dollars in scholarships have been awarded to Preuss students. Throughout Preuss' history it has been awarded "America's Most Challenging High School" by the Washington Post, named one of "America's Most Challenging High Schools" by The Daily Beast. Newsweek had named Preuss the top transformative high school in the Nation three years in a row. University of Southern California has ranked Preuss a "top five charter school in the California". We are a "National Blue Ribbon" school, a "California Gold Ribbon School" and a "California Distinguished School" honored for "outstanding innovative programs". Preuss has yet again earned a Western Association of Schools and Colleges (WASC) Six-Year Accreditation through June 30, 2023. The Preuss School UC San Diego began as the dream of UC San Diego faculty members Cecil Lytle, and then Chancellor Robert Dynes.

Their dream was given life by the generous \$5million dollar donation from Peter and Peggy Preuss who the school is named after with honor. The Preuss School's goal was, and is today, to help low-income, under-represented students to be the first in their families to attend a four-year college or university. The twenty-year success of The Preuss School UC San Diego has been possible because of the faculty, staff, Board members, students, parents, volunteers, mentors, tutors, donors and community members' passion and untiring efforts. The success of The Preuss School UC San Diego has truly been a team effort with a single goal in mind, to prepare Preuss students for college, and to be successful in a four year university. Happy 20th Anniversary to Preuss!

The 2018-2019 school year started on August 13, and we welcomed back 837 students! August was a busy month beginning with the orientation to welcome our new students, including 124 sixth graders. We are looking forward to an exciting academic year.

Congratulations to the Class of 2018. 100 percent of the 95 seniors were accepted to a four-year college or university. 37 percent were accepted to at least one University of California campus. 43 (45%) students are attending a UC campus. 32 students will be attending the UC San Diego campus with 31 on the Chancellor's Associates Scholarship. The program creates "full ride" funding support for qualifying Preuss graduates. 6 (6%) seniors planned to attend a Private or Out of State University, with 11 (12%) seniors planning on attending Community College with plans to transfer to a four-year university.

During the school year, many students participate in Enrichment Programs and Internships that continue into summer programs with UC San Diego and our community partners. These students worked with engineers, doctors, scientists, professors and teachers from UC San Diego, UC San Diego Cancer Center, The Sanford Burnham Prebys Medical Discovery Institute, Pfizer and many other local organizations. We are always looking for more opportunities for our students to gain experience in the workplace. If you would like to learn more about these programs, please have your child contact their Advisory teacher.

Our Admissions process began early this year and the new two-page application is now available for pickup at the Preuss front office. Transportation-

I would like to thank the parents who have contributed to the cost of transportation during last school year and the beginning of this school year. For the 2018-2019 school year, Preuss families are being asked to donate \$20 a month, or \$200 per year, to help defray the cost of school bus transportation. Please contact the main office if you have any questions. For your child's safety, we advise that you DO NOT send cash to school with students for transportation payment.

We continue to contract with the San Diego Unified School District (SDUSD) to transport our students. There have been changes in the pick-up and drop-off schedule and some students were moved to different buses. We have tried to accommodate students with the most suitable bus stop. Mrs. Villanueva, our Transportation Coordinator, has worked closely with SDUSD transportation to make the appropriate adjustments to the bus stops. Implementing bus changes can take up to one month. Please understand that we are doing our best to accommodate all families. If you have questions, please phone Mrs. Villanueva at 858-822-1738.

School Attendance-

Students need to be at Preuss every day and should only be absent if they are sick and/or contagious. The contact number for our school nurse is 858-822-2291. She can provide the information you need on whether your child is well enough to attend school. When students miss school, they miss out on valuable lessons that cannot be recreated with homework; in addition, the school loses money when students are absent. Please do not plan vacation days when Preuss is in session. Thank you for ensuring your child attends school every day; being in school every day equals student success.

ParentSquare-

ParentSquare has proven to be a useful tool in communicating with parents. ParentSquare is a two-way private communication program that provides a safe way for the Preuss School and parents to communicate. If you have any questions regarding ParentSquare please contact your student's Advisory teacher.

Parent Portal-

Parent Portal is your doorway to your student's educational success in each of their classes. Parents are able to view their student's information from the school database using Aeries Parent Portal. You will be able to view your student's demographic data, grades, unofficial transcripts, attendance records, class schedule, progress toward completion of graduation requirements and emergency contact information. Each parent should have received the necessary information through their students' Advisory class to create an account and log into the Aeries Parent Portal. If you did not receive this information, please contact the front office at 858-822-3000.

California Assessment of Student Performance and Progress (CAASPP) -

Parents received CAASPP tests scores in a Student Score Report. Students received an overall score for each subject, ranging from 2,000-3,000. This score shows if students exceeded, met, nearly met or did not meet expectations for their grade. The second page of the report includes a further breakdown of that score, providing individualized information on your child's academic strengths and potential challenges. School results show we are in the mid-range for county schools for 6th, 7th and 8th grades, and above SDUSD. We are in the TOP 5 in San Diego for our 11th graders (English and Math). This again reflects the importance of our program – the longer students stay at Preuss the better they do and the better their scores get.

Please contact the school if you have any questions or concerns. Please contact your child's teacher if your questions are about classes or curriculum. Your child's University Prep/Advisory teacher is also a valuable asset and can answer questions or assist you in getting the appropriate information. You can contact the school by phone or through the Preuss website (preuss.ucsd.edu) to get email addresses of our teachers. Edmodo is also valuable resource as you can check to see the assignments for each class.

I look for our 20th year to be just as successful as our previous 19 years. Let's work together to achieve student success.

Notes from Vice Principal Mr. Pete Selleck

We are off to a great start of another outstanding school year. The success of The Preuss School has always been a result of students, parents, and staff working together toward a common goal.

The Student Handbook

Be sure to review school policies with your child. In addition, check "The Planner" frequently to be sure that your student is using it to stay organized and keep track of homework assignments.

<u>Homework</u>

Students need a quiet place free of distractions to study each night. They also need a designated place to store school materials. Every evening, help your son or daughter to pack up their backpack after homework is complete. This will help them to stay organized, and reduce the stress of trying to hurry out the door on time in the morning.

Cell Phones

Put the charging station in a place where parents can monitor the phone, and students do not have access during homework time, or at bedtime. Cell phones are causing students too many interruptions during study time, and having a negative effect on health. Too many students are not getting enough sleep at night because they have access to their phones all night.

<u>Attendance</u>

Our students do not benefit from the outstanding lessons of our teachers if they are not here. It said that missing a day at Preuss is like missing a week at many other schools. Be aware of the unique school calendar at Preuss. Do not plan any family trips, or other activities, during the school year. Try to schedule appointments on Friday mornings when school starts at 10:15 am. If your child is absent, call the Attendance Office at (858)822-0311. If you get voicemail, leave a message and follow up with a written note. California law requires that the parent notify the school in a timely fashion.

Transportation

Be sure to have your students at their assigned bus stop 10 minutes before the scheduled arrival time. Students may only ride their assigned bus, and may only utilize their assigned stop.

Demand that your student reports any inappropriate behavior to school officials. This is a critical factor in providing a safe environment for all students.

Welcome Back! All textbooks have been checked out to the students and we have just started our 6th grade orientation. The inside of every student planner should be filled out with all their textbook information. Prices may be obtained from their advisory teacher or the librarian. Our first library notices will go out at this month. Remember if your student/s has textbooks from last year or fines totaling more than \$5.00, he/she will not be able to participate in athletics, clubs or school sponsored events. Turning in late textbooks or paying part of their fine will allow them to participate for the month and paying all will put their account in good standing. Students may volunteer to work off their fines.

It is very important that your student checks each and every one of their textbooks for any damage. Damage can include writing, drawings, water/food stains, torn pages and or torn covers. We cleaned and checked all textbooks that came in last year, but things get missed. If the student does not bring any damage to our attention by the end of September then they will be held responsible at the end of the year. It is a \$5.00 minimum charge. TO PREVENT DAMAGE AND EX-TEND THE LIFE OF OR TEXTBOOKS IT IS VERY IMPORTANT TO COVER ALL HARD-BOUND TEXTBOOKS WITH BOOK COVERS WE HAVE HERE IN THE LIBRARY.

We are celebrating Banned Books Week from September 23rd through September 29th. Stop by the library to check out books banned or challenged and read about why the book was banned or challenged. We will be having a contest to celebrate, more details to follow in the daily bulletin.

Online library information is on the Preuss School website. Check us out under Current Students. We have links to our databases, the school catalog, the DCP and Overdrive (our ebook collection site). Students are able to access our ebooks using their student ID number.

We have many new additions for the students to check out. As the books are added to the catalog they are placed on the NEW BOOK bookshelf in the front of the library as you walk in the door.

Greetings from the Attendance and Transportation Office!

Did you know September is Attendance Awareness Month? Attendance is a critical aspect of students' success. Students who attend school on a regular basis are taking the right path toward reaching their full academic potential and learning the skills needed to succeed in life. Your involvement as a parent is important as well.

Attendance is a parent and student responsibility. Talk with your son/daughter about the importance of not skipping school. Absences add up, whether excused or unexcused. When students miss school, they miss the opportunity to learn and can fall behind by missing exams and homework assignments. As you probably already know, the classes at Preuss are demanding. Missing even a couple of days can affect your child. Students should attend school every day unless they are very sick.

In addition, parents can help us make school attendance a top priority by establishing regular night and morning routines. Please make sure your child arrives to school on time, avoid scheduling family trips or doctors' appointments during school hours, and bring your child to school after his/ her appointment. There is a video for parents from Attendance Works featuring parents talking to other parents about reducing absenteeism. Remember, parents must call the school at (858) 822-0311 to report and explain the reason for an absence. This must be done for each day the student is absent. When a student is marked absent and the parent does not notify the school, the school will call the parent to find out why the student did not attend school. 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

All applicants are entered into a random public lottery.
