
2-1-1 Transforming Access to Human Services

"We find that the Information & Referral Petitioners have demonstrated sufficient public benefits to justify use of a scarce public resource and we therefore assign 2-1-1 to be used for access to community information and referral services."







Enrollment Center

- 2-1-1 Pioneered telephonic signatures for public benefit programs.
- Has submitted more than 30,000 applications for CalFresh, Medi-Cal and Covered California.

Health Navigation

 Provides care coordination addressing health and social aspects of the whole person.


Military and Veteran Services

 2-1-1 answers the Courage to Call peer-topeer helpline offering care coordination as the single point of access for veterans, active military, reservists, national guards, and their families.

Person-Centric Model: Courage to Call

Best Practice Models

- Peer-to-Peer Support offered live through a 24 hour call center and web-based chat services.
- Strengths-based case management and care coordination services offered through peer masters level social workers.




Care Coordination

- Navigators provide Peer-to-Peer service coordination/ case management for assigned group of clients
- Develops, evaluates and implements
 intervention goals and plans in conjunction
 with clinical team
- Provides individual supportive coaching in all areas of client's life
- Proactive check-in starting at 7 days, and up to 12 months, to ensure client receives needed services and successful transition support.

Person-Centric Model: 2-1-1 Health Navigation Program

Health Navigation

- Health Navigators assess clients specific health needs, unique to health condition and situation, refer and educate about options and community resources, advocate on behalf of client as needed, and follow-up with client over time to encourage and ensure access of services
- Ensure client screened and referred for health insurance, medical home, education around prevention and management of condition and continued support
- Collaborates with community agencies to offer direct connections to well known partners to ensure coordination of care






How Did 2-1-1 Get Into Disaster Business?

- 2001 The necessity for 2-1-1 as a means of aggregating resources and enhancing post-disaster assistance become apparent after 9/11.
- Governor of Connecticut optimizes statewide 2-1-1 system to assist those searching for loved ones.
- Brookings Institute later called 9/11 response in NYC and DC "disjointed and haphazard" health and human services system.
- Released follow up report "Calling 2-1-1: Enhancing the Washington Region's Safety Net After 9/11" specifically recommending the implementation of a 2-1-1 system.
- 2005 Post Katrina and Rita disasters, FEMA issued an After-Action-Report follow-up that recognized the accomplishments of 2-1-1 recommending that states move forward on statewide 2-1-1 implementation.
- 2006 FEMA formally recognizes 2-1-1 as a information channel during times of disaster.


