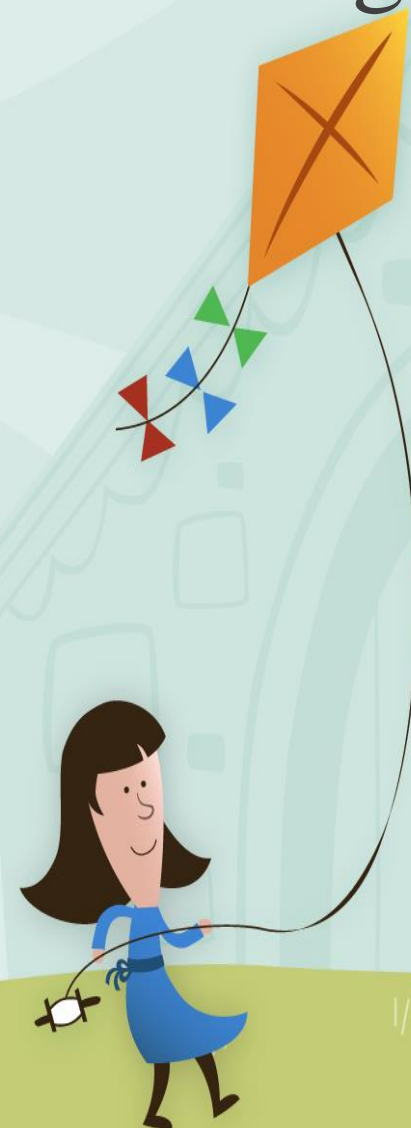
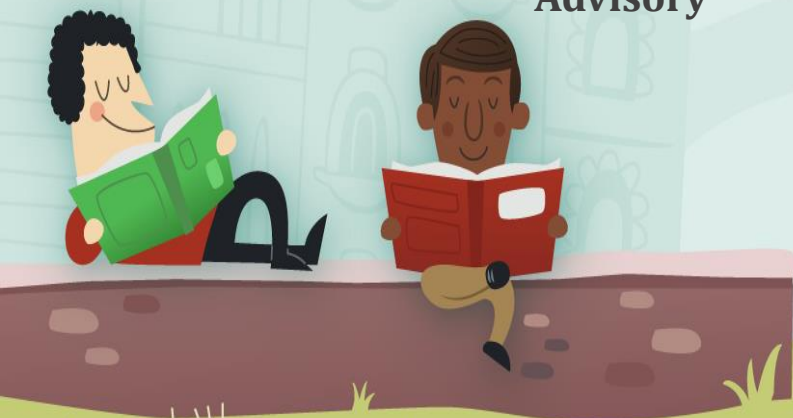

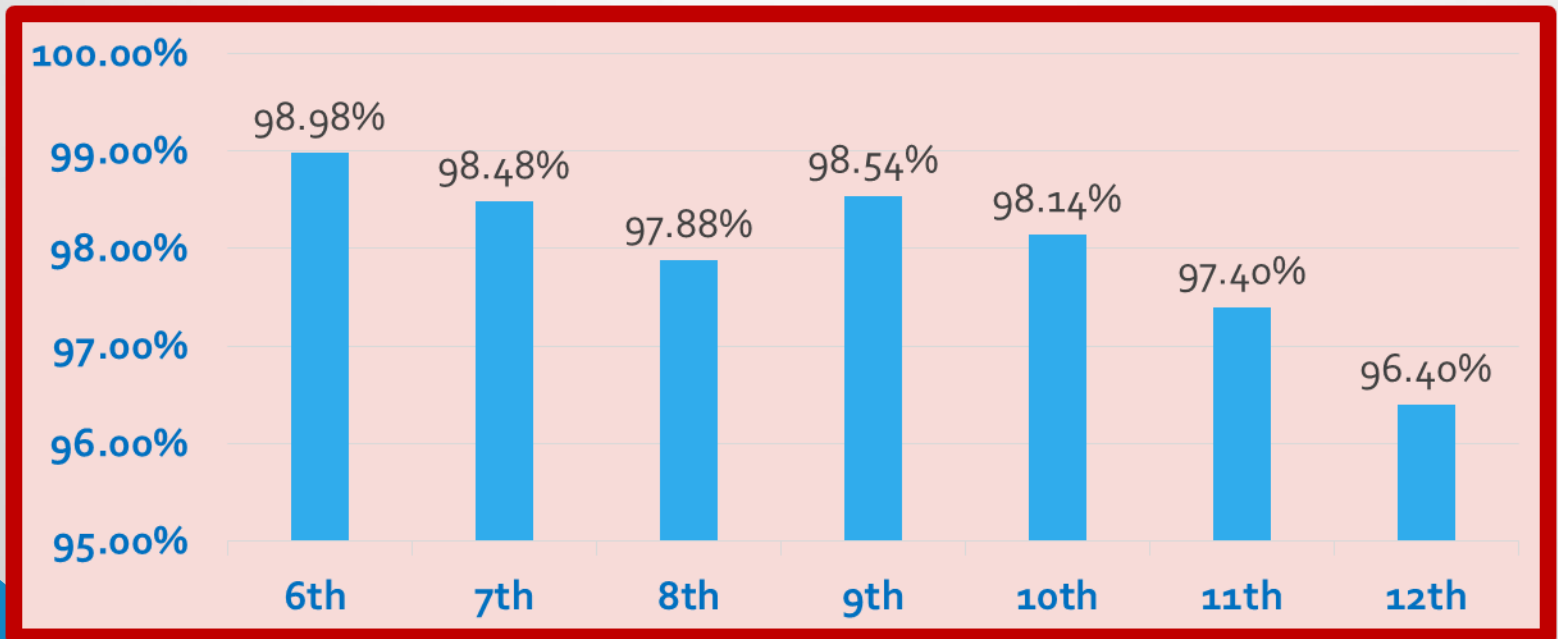

California Assessment of Student Performance and Progress (CAASPP)

- Talk to your student about the scores

Covered California

- By law, most people are now required to have health insurance or pay a penalty when they file their taxes.
- Californians can apply through Covered California and select the health insurance plan that works best for their needs and budget.
- The open-enrollment period happens once a year. Once open enrollment ends, you may enroll in a Covered California health plan only if you have a qualifying life event that makes you eligible to apply.
- Some examples of qualifying life events are: losing your health coverage, getting married, moving outside your plan's coverage area, having a baby and turning 26. To see if you qualify, visit www.CoveredCA.com/individuals-and-families/getting-covered/special-enrollment. Individuals and families may also qualify for Medi-Cal benefits.

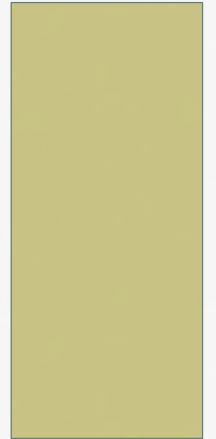

- ◆ **Provide comprehensive Inclusive sexual health education**
- ◆ **Receive HIV/AIDS prevention education, as specified**
- ◆ **Consists of Age Appropriate Instruction**
- ◆ **Taught in MS/HS**
- ◆ **All factual material presented will be medically accurate and objective**

INSTRUCTION

- ◆ **State mandates that instruction be taught once in middle school and once in high school**

PURPOSE

- **Students need the knowledge and skills necessary to have healthy, positive and safe relationships and behaviors**
- **To promote understanding of sexuality as a normal part of human development.**
- **To ensure pupils receive integrated, comprehensive, accurate, and unbiased sexual health and HIV prevention instruction and provide educators with clear tools and guidance to accomplish that end**

PARENT INVOLVEMENT

Parent Monitoring- know where they are and the people they are with. Also monitor what they are seeing on their devices

Parent and Student Communication- Students talk with parents about sex students delay having sex and use protection when they do have sex

Family Connectedness- Close relationships with their family are more likely to have sex less frequently

SCHOOL FACTORS

- ◆ **Sexual Health Education Policies, Services and Curricula**
Sexual health education programs in schools can decrease adolescent sexual risk behaviors
- ◆ **Supportive school climate.** **Victims of bullying and sexual harassment may be more likely to have casual sex and sex under the influence of drugs and/or alcohol.**
- ◆ **School connectedness.** **Teens who believe that adults and peers in their school care about their learning as well as about them as individuals feel connected to their school and are more likely to delay the start of sexual activity, use condoms and other contraceptives, and have fewer sexual partners.**

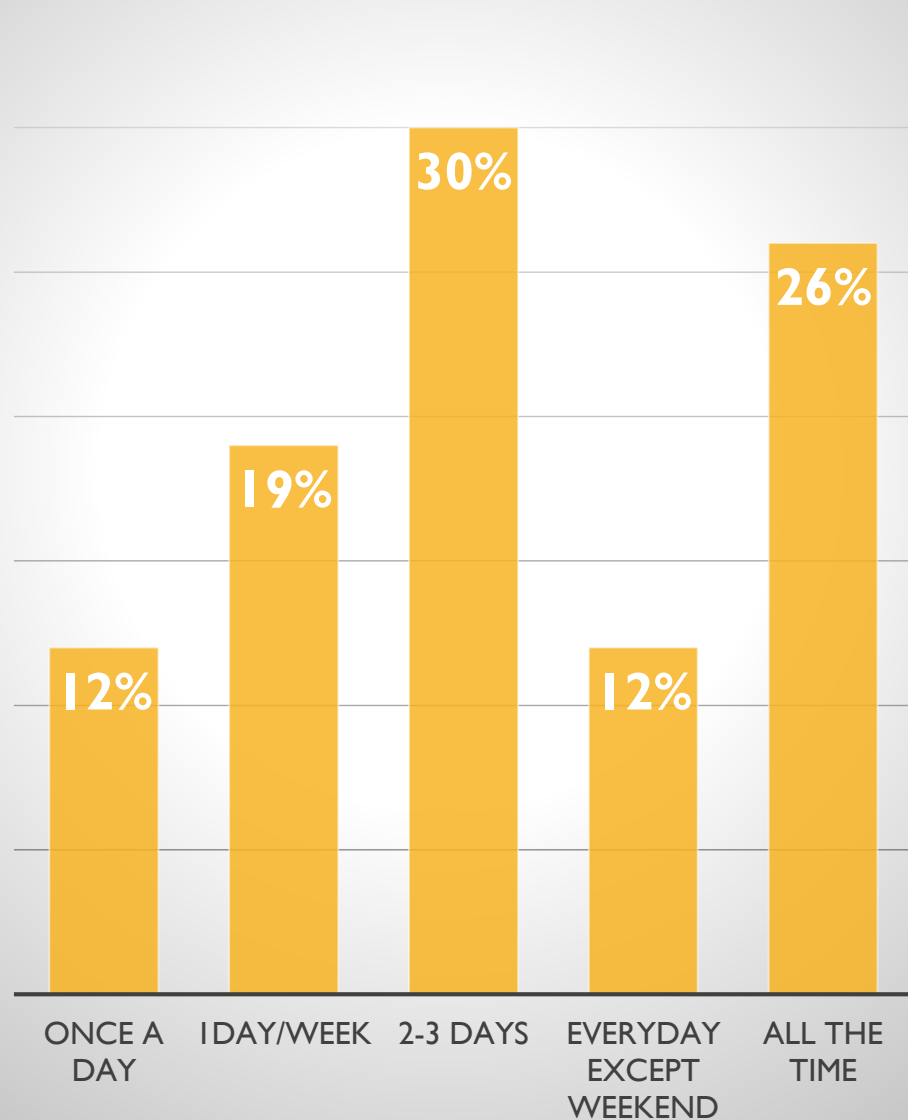

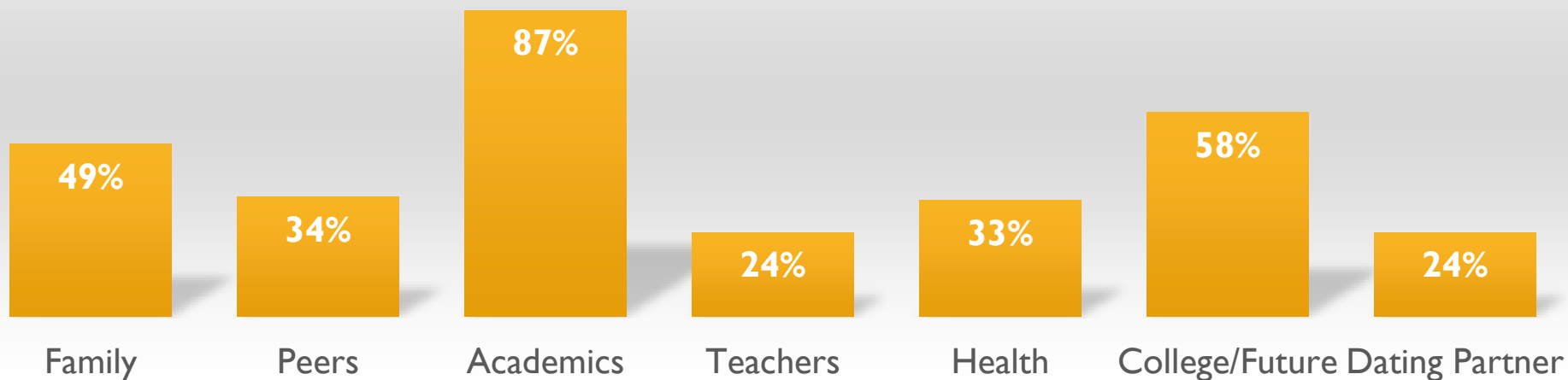
How often do you feel stressed? 7-8 grade



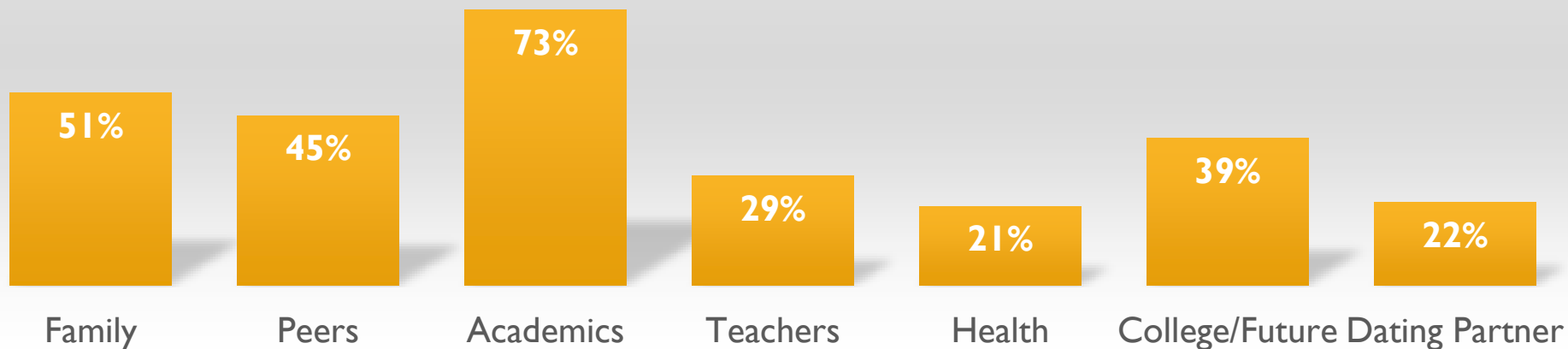
How often do you feel stressed? 9-12 grade

What stressed me out? *7-8 grade*

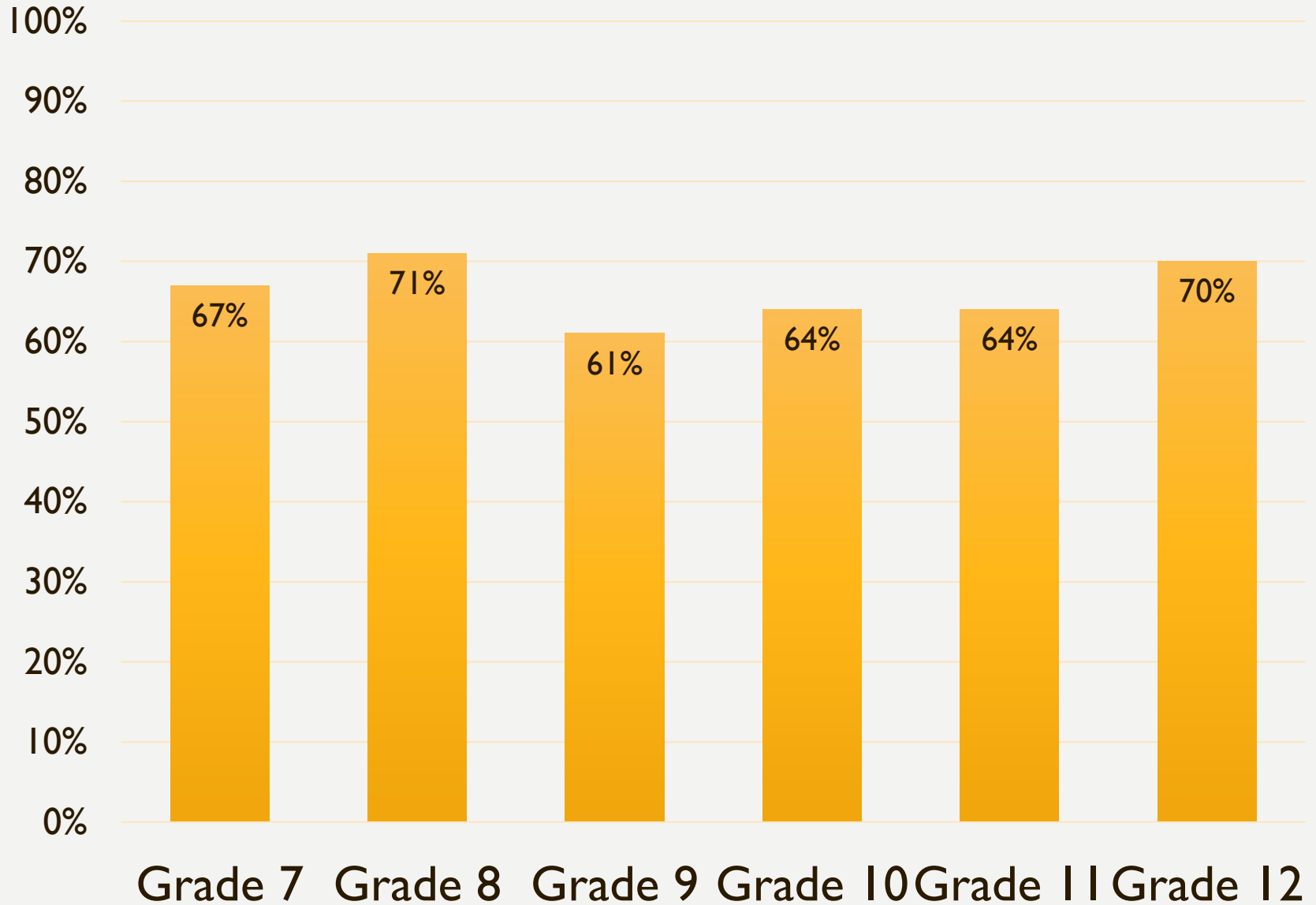

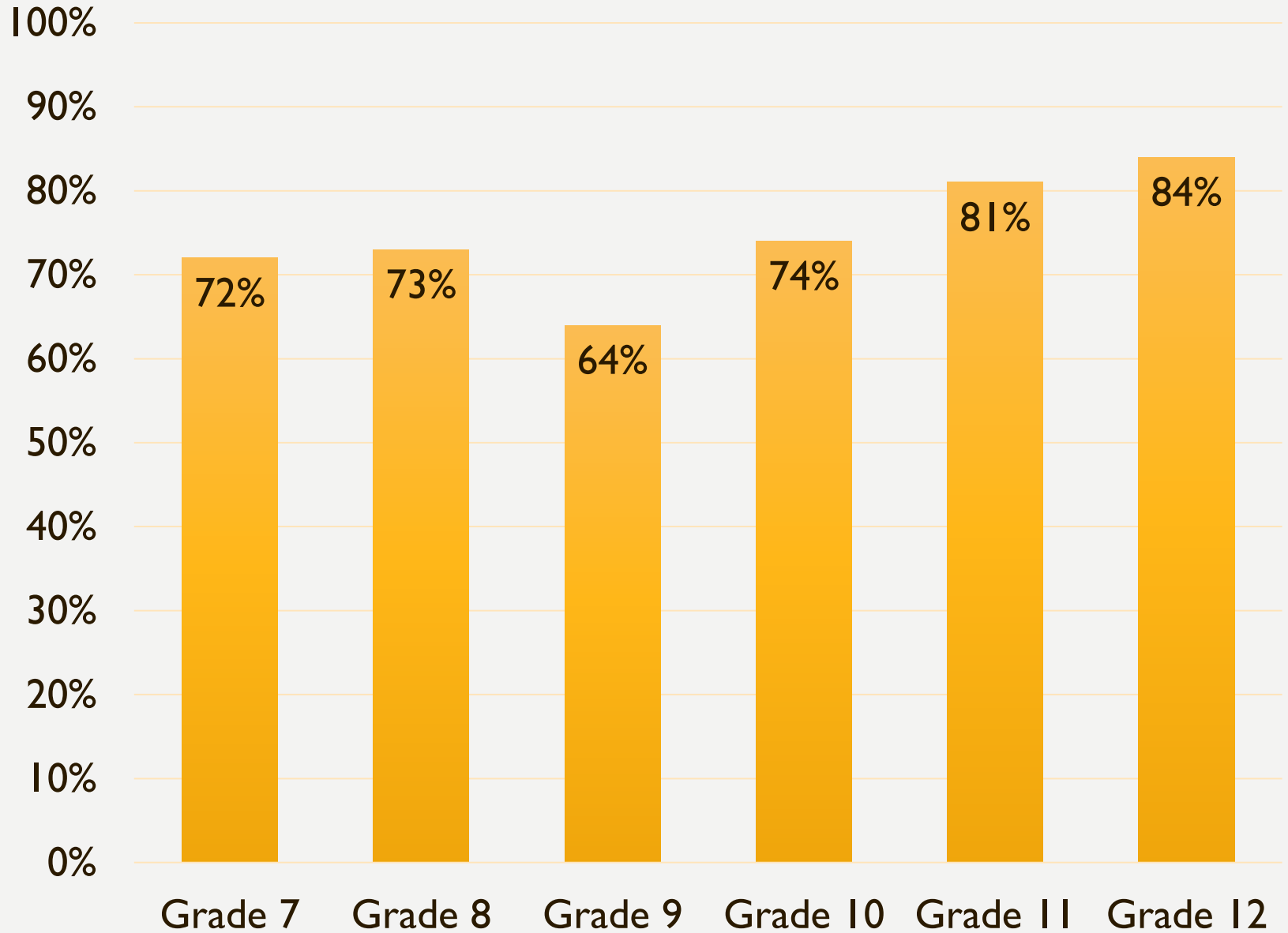


I feel close to people at this school strongly agree/agree

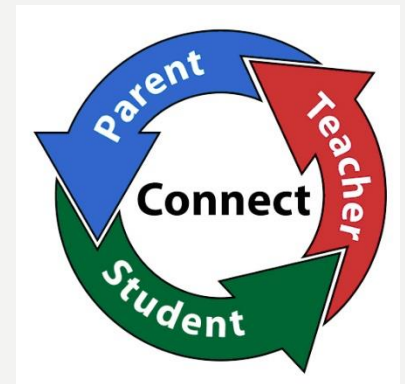

PARENT SUPPORT IS VITAL

*Parents are the most important adults in students' lives, and they can support students in both academic and personal ways.



HOW YOU CAN ENSURE SUCCESS AT HOME...

- ***Practice Accountability/Responsibility***

- Nightly routine that you *both* participate in is critical.
- Check-in at the beginning and end/supervise homework time
- Prioritize and organize assignments
- Provide appropriate study space (NO TV/phone)

- ***Show Interest***

- Set aside discussion time to review planner together and converse about school
- Tutoring (After School or SEA)
- Good nutrition and plenty of sleep
- Help practice and refine skills that are helpful in becoming a strong college applicant

HOMEWORK

- Set expectations/time/space for homework.
- Follow through 100% of the time. Be consistent.
- Make sure you understand their schedule, classes and planner.
- “What did you do in block 1 today? What is your homework? What could you do to get ahead in this class?”

- **NO HOMEWORK?**
 - Ask about every class and find out what they’re working on. See if there are future deadlines that a student can start working toward (think about small steps they can take to meet the goal).
 - Study English Vocab and test their words with you.
 - Every student should have 3 hours of homework per night and do at least 1 hour of studying/independent reading as a plan B

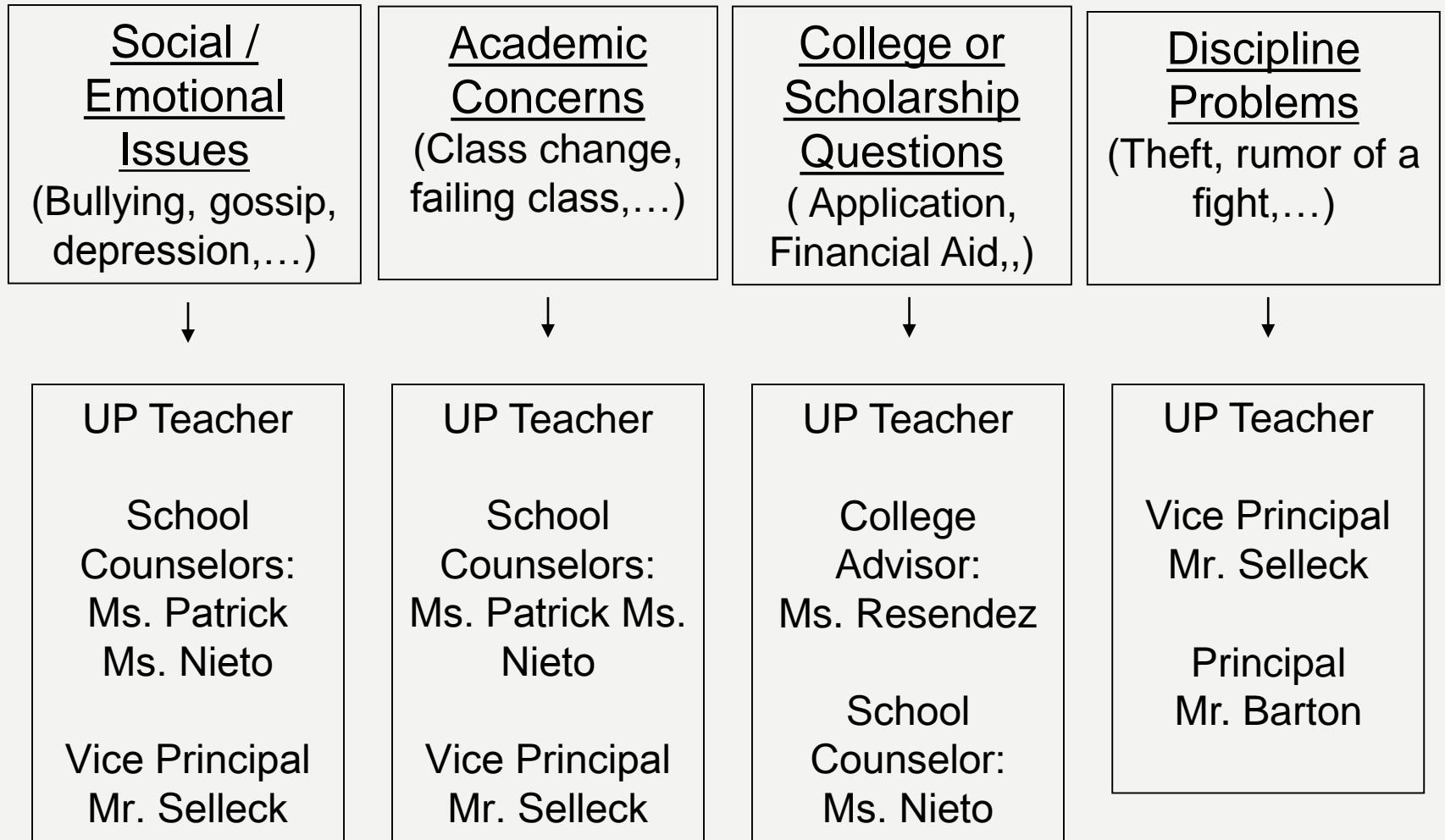

University Preparatory (UP) Overview

THE PREUSS SCHOOL UCSD



WHAT IS UNIVERSITY PREP/ADVISORY?

- University Prep is commonly called Advisory
- It is a class that serves as a structured system of student support.
- It has its own curriculum that consists of a variety of lessons, activities, and instruction from the following content areas:
 - College research, preparation, and information
 - Behaviors that encourage success in school
 - Character development, healthy lifestyles, and decision making
 - Reading and math support (KBAR and KBAC)
 - Event and test preparation
 - Academic subject support through tutorials or access to resources in class



WHAT IS THE PURPOSE OF ADVISORY?

- Provide support for our students so they can be academically eligible for admission to the Universities of California (UC) and California State Universities (CSU)
- Create a support network for the students:
 - The advisory teacher is the student's first point of contact on campus and the first point of contact for parents.
 - Students stay with the same group of grade-level peers throughout their Preuss education and develop strong bonds with each other and the teacher. In many cases they have the same UP teacher from 6th grade through 12th grade.



WHAT HAPPENS DURING ADVISORY?

- **Advisory class is not just a study hall or tutorial period.**
 - **Students complete assignments and projects just like they do for any other class.**
 - **Every class has KBAR each day and KBAC once per week.**
 - **Kick Back and Read (KBAR) is sustained silent reading for approximately 30 min.**
 - **Kick Back and Calculate (KBAC) is a weekly math assignment (IXL), assigned by their math teacher, for students to practice in advisory class what they are learning in math class. In many cases, students get credit in both classes for completing their IXL assignments with a 90% or higher score.**



WHAT ARE THE RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE ADVISORY TEACHER?

- Provide a classroom environment that encourages school success.
- Distribute and collect papers from the school that require parents to receive, and sometimes sign and return to school (Registration packet, progress reports)
- Prepare the class for upcoming school wide events (Standardized tests, Spring Learning Showcase)
- Develop plans and interventions for students who are struggling academically.
- Regularly monitor students' grades and communicate with parents, teachers, and counselors about student achievement.
- Schedule initial student interventions as needed and expect to attend those meetings.



WHAT DO ADVISORY TEACHERS DO?

Meet with core teachers to discuss methods of support	Write letters of recommendation for colleges, scholarships, and clubs
Provide instruction on test-taking strategies	Provide instruction on professional emails and proper interview etiquette
Verify tutoring attendance	Conduct mini-lessons on SAT and ACT preparation
