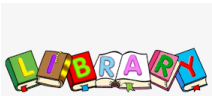

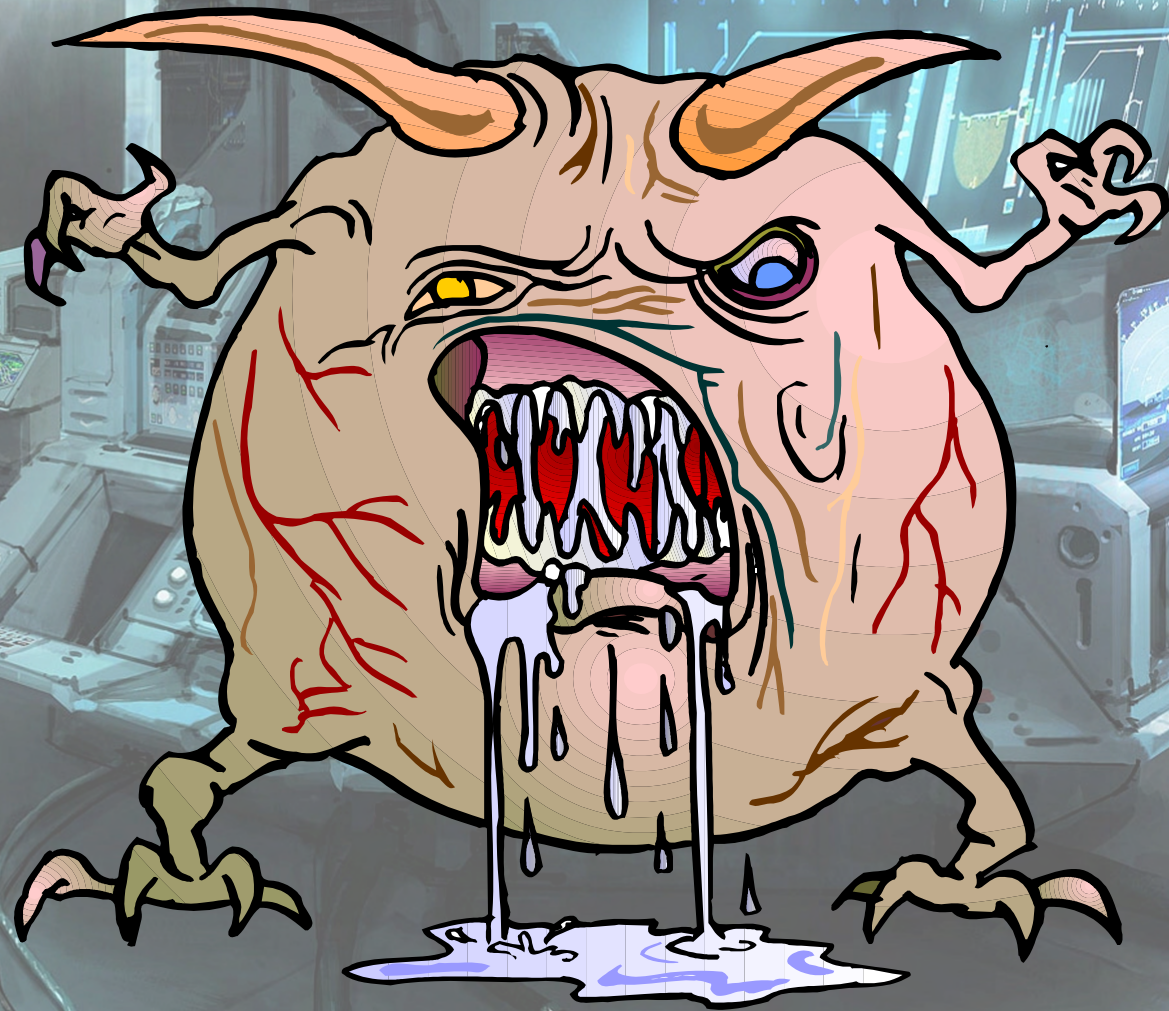

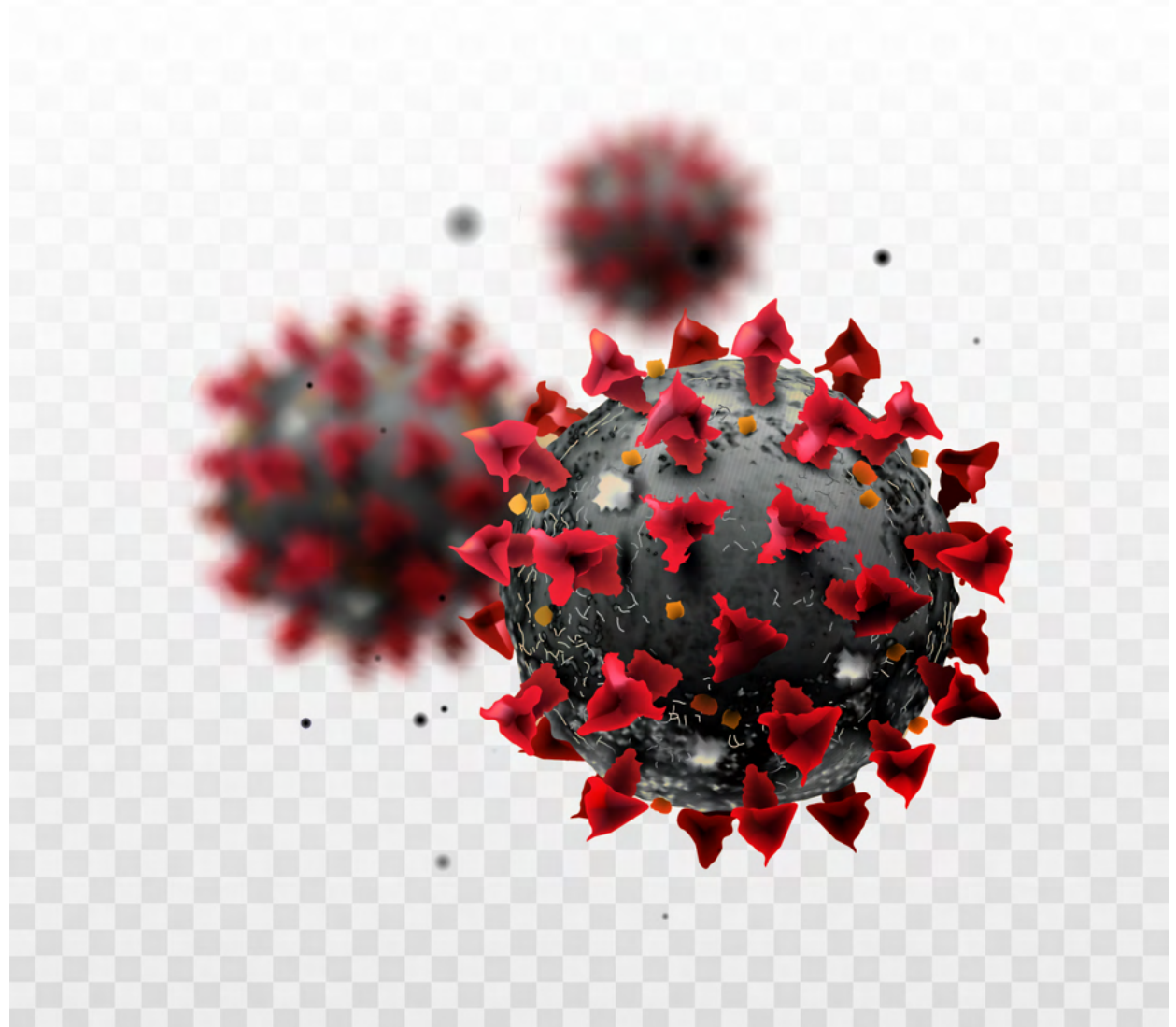

Online Statistics Parents Should Know

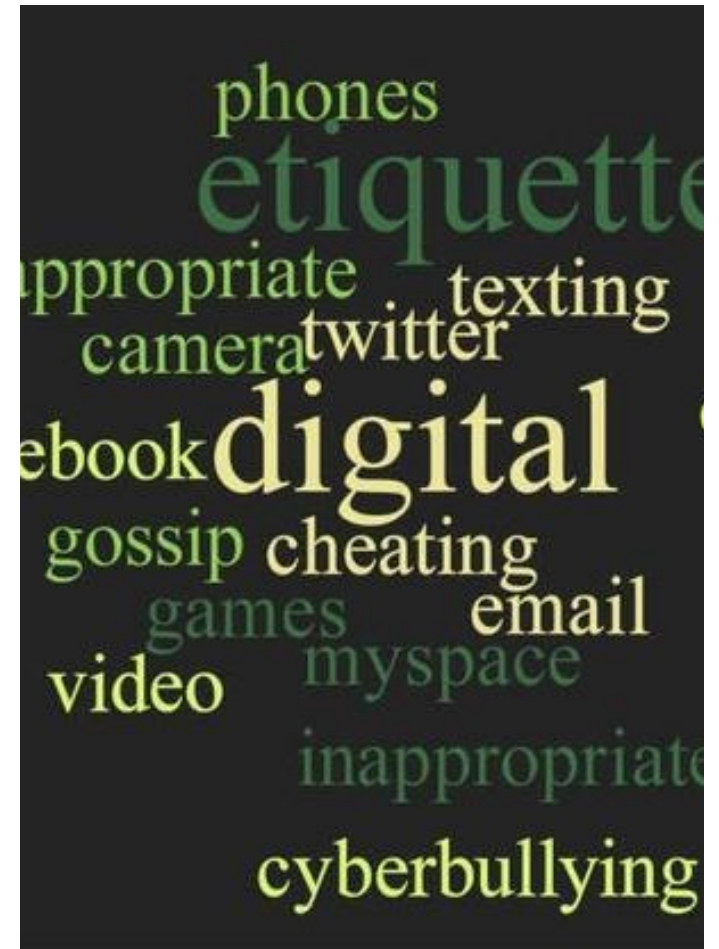
- Internet Crime is the fastest growing crime in the US and children are the fastest growing victim pool
- 82% of sex crimes involving minors are initiated from social media because child predators use your child's information online
- Over 65% of the cases, a child's social profile provides info on their school and/or home
- 20% of teenagers received unwanted sexual solicitation – requests to engage in sexual activities or sexual talk on the internet
- 73% of youth who receive aggressive solicitations met the predator online
- Only one third of kids report the sexual crimes
- While girls are most vulnerable, boys are victims too

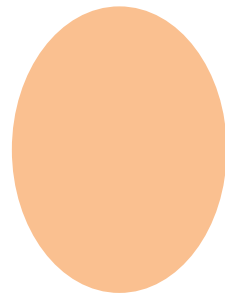

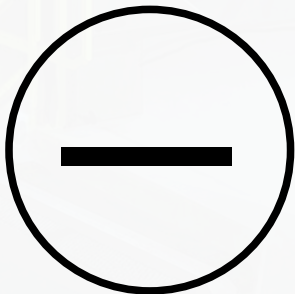

Megan Taylor Meier

was an American teenager who died by suicide by hanging herself three weeks before her 14th birthday. A year later, Meier's parents prompted an investigation into the matter and her suicide was attributed to cyberbullying through the social media.

Jamey Rodemeyer was found dead by his older sister Alyssa in the backyard on the morning of September 18, 2011, in an apparent suicide by hanging. He was bullied with online gay slurs for more than a year.



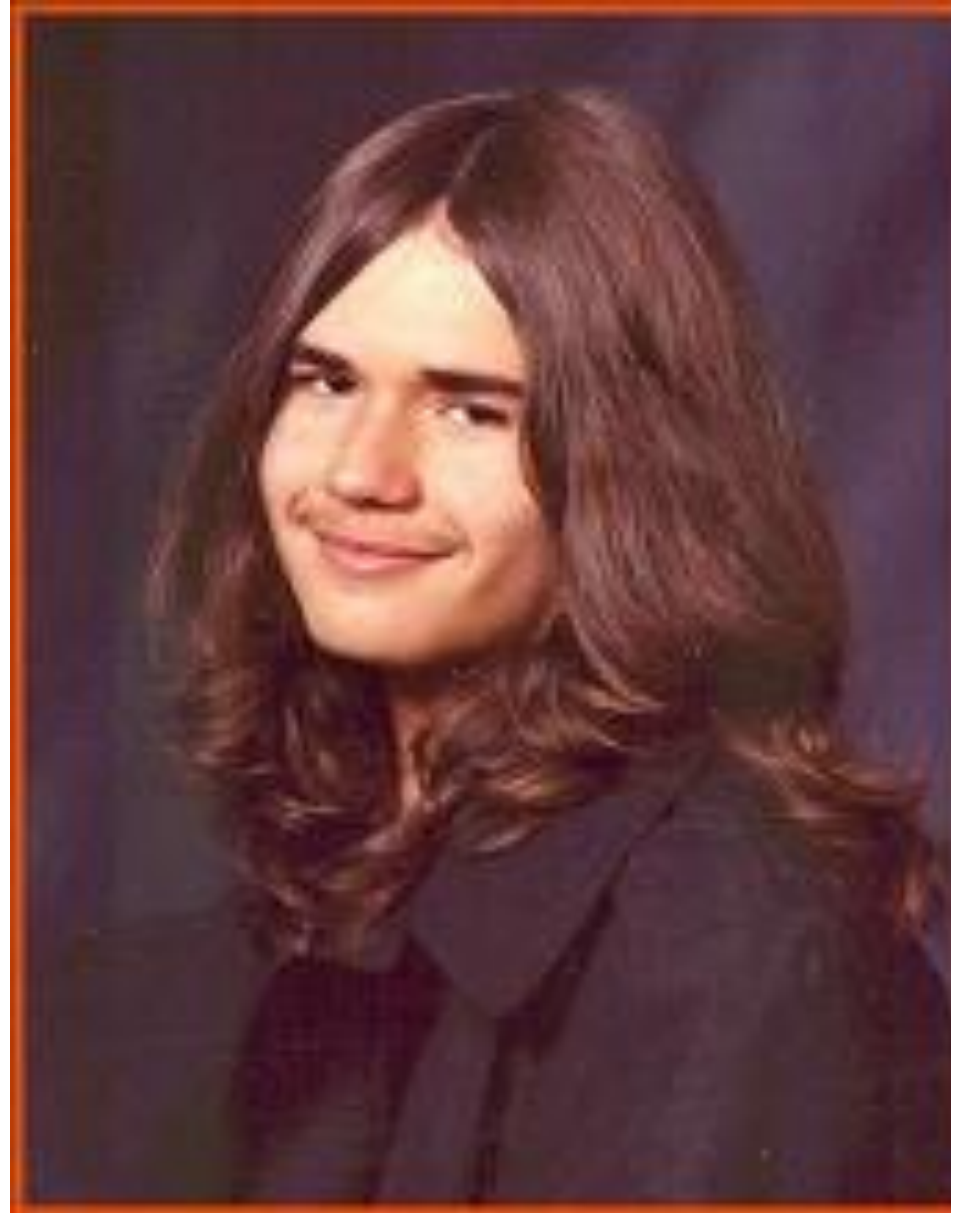
Ryan Patrick

Halligan (December 18, 1989 – October 7, 2003) was an American student who committed suicide at the age of 13 after being bullied by his classmates in person and cyber-bullying online. According to the Associated Press, Halligan was repeatedly sent homophobic instant messages, and was "threatened, taunted and insulted incessantly".



Jeffrey Johnson

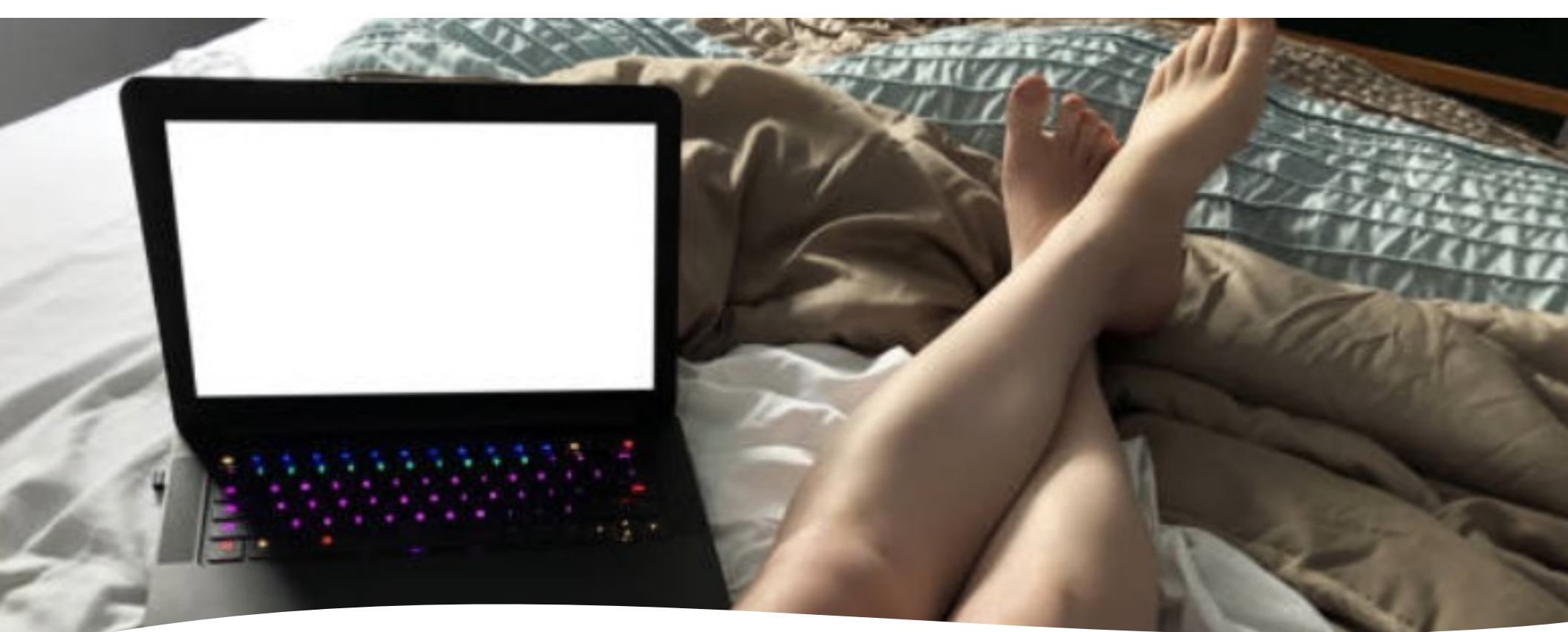
- *"Mom, where can I go? Everybody knows. There's no place I can hide." - Jeffrey Johnston.*
- On June 29, 2005, Jeffrey Johnston committed suicide, the victim of relentless bullying over a period of two years. The Cape Coral student, with an A average, was 15 years old. He didn't know how to handle the avalanche of emotional pain that swept through him as a result of bullying through the Internet and phone calls. He was called fat and ugly. Emotionally crippled by the cyberattacks that left him with nowhere to go, cost him his friends and made him question his sexuality, he kissed his mom goodnight, went into his room, then into a closet and hanged himself.



Sexting is a Form of Inappropriate Content

- Sending sexually explicit messages, photos, or videos from any digital device
- Includes photos and videos containing nudity or simulated sex acts
- Also includes text messages that talk about sex





Dangers of Sexting

Sexting images may find their way to the Internet and from there to sex offenders and other exploiters

Sexting may lead to bullying and harassment by peers both online and offline

If a child forward a sexual image of someone underage, that child could face child pornography charges, go to jail, and be required to register as a sex offender

Sexting Can Lead to Sextortion: a Form of Extortion

- Where explicit images are used to make teens send additional photos, sexual favors, and sometimes money from victims
- It can involve “catfishing” where predators lure unsuspecting victims into online relationships and coerce them into sharing nude photos or videos

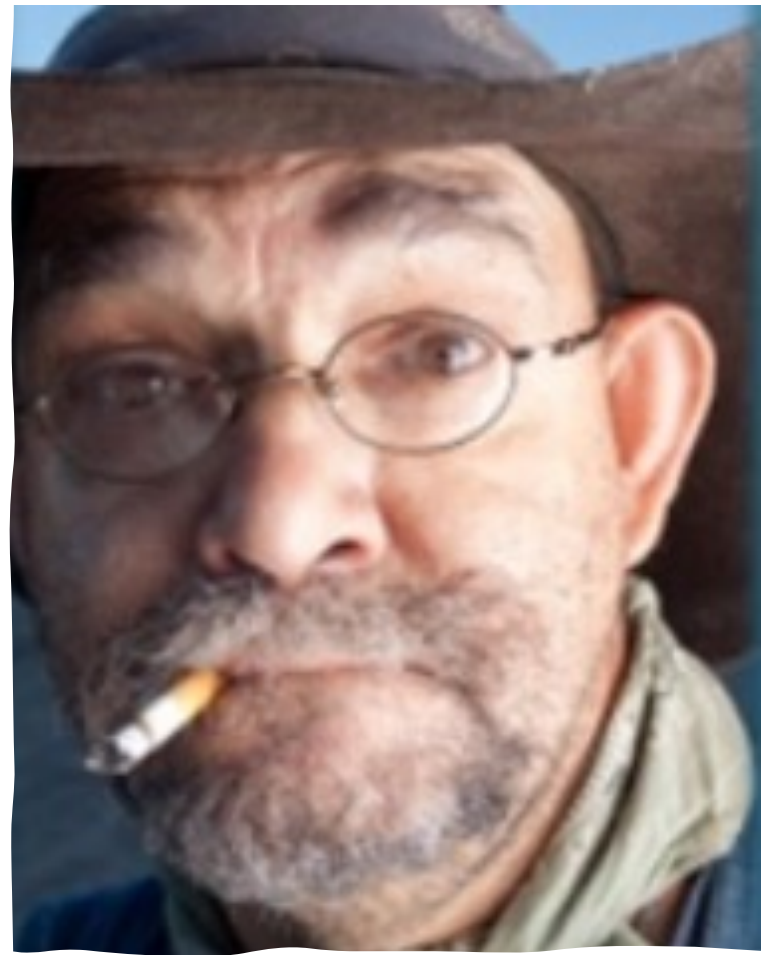


How Does Grooming Happen?

- Predators often pretend to be a friend at school, a love interest, a modeling or talent scout, or role model
- Offer false promises, attention, affection, adventure, gifts
- Drive a wedge between teens and their parents, guardians, and friends
- Gain the child's trust - then use it to exploit them

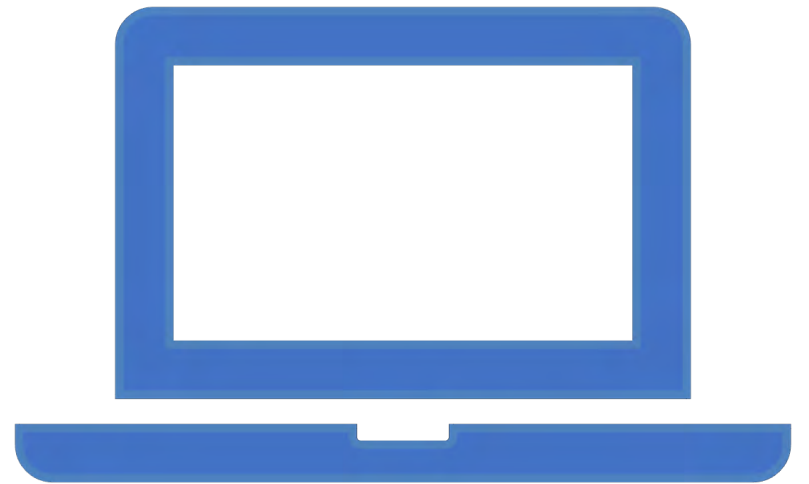

Why Colleges Look at Students' Social Media

Colleges don't always review social media, and doing so can help or hurt a student's odds of admission.

WITH A SINGLE-DIGIT acceptance rate, **Harvard University** in Massachusetts has been among the toughest schools to get into. But in recent years, some students who cleared that high bar for admission had their acceptance rescinded before even stepping on campus. The reason: **inappropriate social media posts**.

Experts say that colleges want more than just a student with **good grades** and impressive test scores — they want someone of high character.

"As a residential campus, when we're reviewing candidates, we're just not admitting students for the classroom; we're admitting students to be a part of this community," says Marilyn Hesser, executive director of admission at the **University of Richmond** in Virginia.

The University of Richmond doesn't look at an applicant's social media accounts, Hesser says, unless the student sends links highlighting profiles. Another scenario is that admissions officers may look at social media if troubling information about a candidate is sent by a third party, often someone who remains anonymous.

While Hesser says applicants have been turned down "on rare occasions" for social media posts, it still happens both at Richmond and at colleges across the country.

According to a **2017 survey** administered by the American Association of Collegiate Registrars and Admissions Officers, 11% of respondents said they "denied admission based on social media content" and another 7% rescinded offers for the same reason.

Nowadays, the documents you submit to your potential employer (cover letter, résumé, references) will not be the only he or she looks at. In fact, more than half of employers are probably going to also check out your accounts on social networks.

The data comes from the UK business psychology firm OPP, which is presenting its findings this week at the British Psychological Society (BPS) conference on occupational psychology. One of the papers by the business psychologists covers a 2011 study into the use of social networks such as Facebook, LinkedIn, and Twitter.



56 percent of employers said that they were likely to check out the social media presence of potential employees (although 27 percent of those surveyed said they would be uncomfortable with the same being done to them). 37 percent of people say they change their persona online — so looking at their online presence may be misleading anyway. On the other hand, a recent study said **your Facebook personality is genuine**, so it may not be that misrepresentative after all.

So what advice does the OPP have for jobseekers? It's all common sense: lock down your Facebook profile, and behave on LinkedIn as you would at a professional networking event. It also wouldn't hurt to **check your Facebook privacy settings**.

- Parents in National City woke up to find their 11- year- old daughter not in her bed
- 8 hours later they found her in an apartment with her captor
- The child knew her captor and her parents knew they had an “extremely inappropriate” relationship with her and had done everything they could to keep her from seeing or speaking to her including removing her devices
- The 11-year-old found an old device and began to communicate with him through Roblox
- On its website, Roblox claims it offers millions of games, connecting players from all over the world

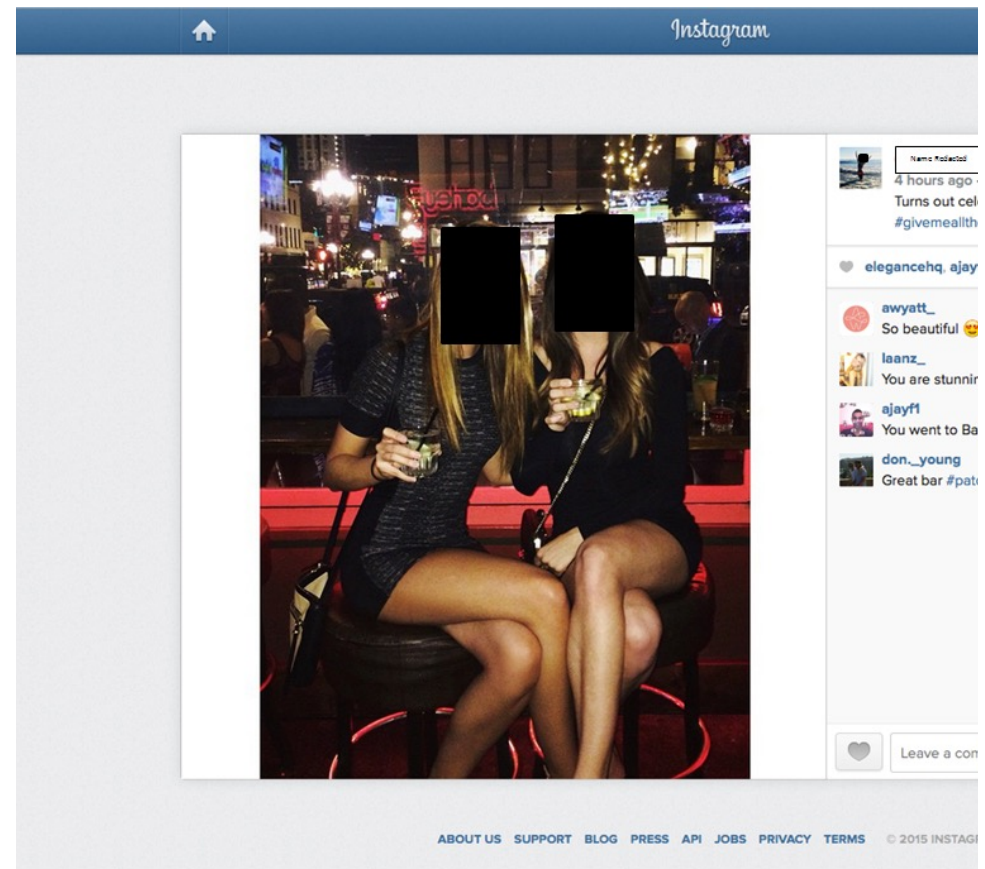

What Can Parents Do?

Require	Require children to allow you to be their “friend” on social media
Review/ approve	Review/ approve games and apps before they are downloaded
Make	Make privacy settings as strict as possible for online gaming, phones and other devices
Monitor	Monitor your child’s use of the Internet and keep computers in an open area
Encourage	Encourage open-parent communication around Internet Safety

Tell Your Teens Protect Themselves Online

Make

Make settings private

Set

Set photos on highest link of internet security so strangers cannot download your images

Accept

Accept friend requests only from people they have met in person

Tell

Encourage your kids to talk to you or a trusted adult if someone suggests they send sexy or provocative photos, or offers you a job or travel opportunity

Talk

Encourage your kids to talk to you or a trusted adult if they receive sexual images or inappropriate links from another person



Protecting Children Online

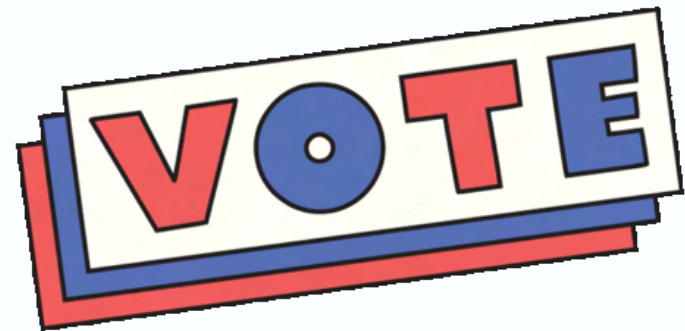
