


We now turn our focus to what is currently happening at the Preuss School. As always, I invite you to check out the articles and enjoy reading about our wonderful school.

# Keep Your Child On Track in Middle and High School: Pay Attention to Attendance

Even as children grow older and more independent, families play a key role in making sure students access learning opportunities and understand why attendance is so important for success in school and on the job. Families can also advocate for resources to help students learn if they cannot attend in-person.

#### DID YOU KNOW?

- · Students should miss no more than 9 days of school each year to stay engaged, successful and on track to graduation.
- Frequent absences can be a sign that a student is losing interest in school, struggling with school work, dealing with a bully or facing some other difficulty.
- . By 6th grade, absenteeism is one of three signs that a student may drop out of high school.
- · By 9th grade, attendance is a better predictor of graduation rates than 8th grade test scores.
- · Missing 10%, or 2 days a month, over the course of the school year, can affect a student's academic success.

#### WHAT YOU CAN DO

#### Make school attendance a priority

- · Talk about the importance of showing up to school every day.
- · Help your teen maintain daily routines, such as finishing homework and getting a good night's sleep.
- . Try not to schedule dental and non-Covid-19 related medical appointments during the school day.
- . Keep your student healthy, and if you are concerned about Covid-19, call your school for advice.
- If your teens must stay home because they are sick or in quarantine, make sure they have asked teachers for resources and materials to make up for the missed learning time in the classroom.

#### Help your teen stay engaged

- · Find out if your children feel engaged by their classes, and feel safe from bullies and other threats.
- Make sure your teens are not missing class because of challenges with behavioral issues or school discipline policies. If any of these are problems, contact the school and work with them to find a solution.
- Monitor you teen's academic progress and seek help from teachers or tutors when necessary. Make sure teachers know how to contact you.
- Stay on top of your child's social contacts. Peer pressure can lead to skipping school, while students without many friends can feel isolated.
- . Encourage your teen to join meaningful after-school activities, including sports and clubs.
- · Notice and support your students if they are showing signs of anxiety.

#### **Communicate with the school**

- . Know the school's attendance policy incentives and penalties.
- . Check on your teen's attendance to be sure absences are not adding up.
- · Seek help from school staff, other parents or community agencies if you need support.



# **Whispers From The Library**

Welcome to the 2023-2024 School Year!

We checked out textbooks. Laptops, chrome books and hotspots (only for students who do not have any internet service) are only checked out to students who need a device at home. All classrooms have a laptop cart with a class set of laptops to use at school.

Students who checked out a device are responsible for the care of these devices. Intentional damage will result in fines added to their library account. It is very important to contact <a href="tech@preuss.ucsd.edu">tech@preuss.ucsd.edu</a> if any problems arise.

A broken screen or damaged keyboard is \$40.00

A lost or chewed charger is \$15-\$25.

A missing barcode is \$5.00.

Please encourage your student to carry the devise with both hands, do not carry by the screen and minimize food and drink near the device.

Library notices are sent via email at the beginning of each month. Notices inform the students of any materials overdue and any fines they need to pay. Students may volunteer before school and at lunch to waive their fines. For every hour, we waive \$10.00.

Online library information is on the Preuss School website. Check us out under Campus Life > Library. We have links to our databases, the school catalog, and Sora by Overdrive (our eBook collection site). Students are also able to access eBooks by downloading the SORA APP on their phone, choosing Preuss as their library and using their student ID number to login.






