## **Attendance Notices**

### Dear Parents and Guardians of our Esteemed Scholars,

We are so excited to welcome our scholars and families back for the 2024-2025 academic year! I would like to take this opportunity to emphasize the value of daily attendance for student learning.

As a reminder, we ask parents to plan time off from school in accordance with our school calendar. Our next long break is Thanksgiving Break (November 25-29). We urge students and families to avoid absences before and after the scheduled breaks.

Regular attendance is critical to a student's success in school. Students who are frequently absent miss social interaction and direct instruction from teachers, even if written assignments can be made up. As long as your child is healthy, please support the school by sending your student to attend class. If your child is struggling and needs support, please reach out to our nurse and counselors who can provide you with resources to better support your family. At the Preuss School, we are all committed to help your child learn, thrive, and succeed.

#### **VERIFICATION OF ABSENCES**

Parents are required to verify an absence by calling or sending a note to the attendance office in order to validate the reason for the student's absence. You can report your child's absence to Ms. Allie Lee at (858) 822-0311 or e-mail to attendance@preuss.ucsd.edu. If you verify an absence through ParentSquare, please make sure you clear the absence on the day the student missed school. For students that are out sick for longer than 2 days and students that are out due to medical appointments, we require medical excuse notes for their absences.

Parents may call to verify a child's absence up to 72 hours after the child has been absent. Absences that are not verified will be considered unexcused absences. After our attendance month accounting cycle closes, unexcused absences due to no verification cannot be changed. If you are not receiving the attendance notices, please make sure that you are registered in ParentSquare. The front office staff is available to assist if you have any issues with your account.

It is a pleasure for the Student Services team to welcome you to the 2024-2025 school year! A special welcome to our new students. Our goal is to offer guidance and support to students in the Academic, Personal/Social, College/Career Planning areas. We are available to assist and meet with students about a variety of topics such as: anxiety, grades, academic organization, & college and career pathways. At the beginning of the year the counselors went into the middle school and high school advisory classes to introduce ourselves and have students take a survey about what they need this year from our department. We also talked specifically to 10th/11th and 12th graders about their transcripts and their graduation status.

After gathering the information from our student's voices through our needs assessment we are scheduling presentations on preparing for college, FAFSA/CADAA workshop and academic motivation presentations.

Our Family Support Specialists are also using this data to help students that have identified as having stress or anxiety this year.

Our Family Support Specialists along with UPAC are providing direct therapy and counseling to students.

October is National Bullying Prevention Month, and in November our 6th grade students will experience a play called Safa's Story which is a culturally responsive play that uses live music, storytelling and spoken word to get to know Safa- a Zimbabwean-American 5th grader who over the course of the show is isolated for being different than her peers. Safa's Story is a play for children and families and was designed to create dialogue about diversity and acceptance.

#### <u>Mental Health & Wellness Tips for</u> <u>Students</u>

- 1. Get 8-10 hours of sleep nightly. Sleep is vitally important for your health and development and is essential for energy, mood, and attentional functions.
- 2. Develop and foster authentic social connections. Make it a regular routine to safely connect with others. Social support networks are key in managing stress.
- 3. Develop a daily routine and establish time for schoolwork, socialization, and other enjoyable hobbies. Developing a routine will increase a feeling of agency, control, and predictability.
- 4. Time management and organization will also help reduce stress associated with academic pressures.
- 5. Find time to exercise or move your body everyday. Routine exercise has been shown to reduce stress and depression and boost overall health. If you are feeling depressed, anxious, hopeless, or having thoughts of suicide, talk to a trusted adult, your advisory teacher, parent or counselor.

# Whispers From the Library

### Welcome to the 2024-2025 School Year!

We checked out textbooks. Laptops, chrome books and hotspots (only for students who do not have any internet service) are only checked out to students who need a device at home. All classrooms have a laptop cart with a class set of laptops to use at school.

Students who checked out a device are responsible for the care of these devices. Intentional damage will result in fines added to their library account. It is very important to contact tech@preuss.ucsd.edu if any problems arise.

- A broken screen or damaged keyboard is \$40.00
- A lost or chewed charger is \$20-\$33.
- A missing barcode is \$5.00.

Please encourage your student to carry the device with both hands and do not carry by the screen. Keep away from younger siblings, pets and minimize food and drink near the device.

Library notices are sent via email at the beginning of each month. Notices inform the students of any materials overdue and any fines they need to pay. Students may volunteer before school and at lunch to waive their fines. For every hour, we waive \$10.00. Online library information is on the <u>Preuss School website</u>. Or, check us out under Campus Life > Library. We have links to our databases, the school catalog, and Sora by Overdrive (our eBook collection site). Students are also able to access eBooks by downloading the SORA APP on their phone, choosing Preuss as their library and using their student ID number to login.






#### **6th Grade Intern Activity**






## **ARC NEWS**
